

### CITY OF LANCASTER FUNDING OPPORTUNTIES COMMUNITY PARTNER PROGRAMS/PROJECTS Program Year 2025 Letter of Interest Process & Instructions

## **OVERVIEW & RESPONSE INSTRUCTIONS**

**PURPOSE**: The City of Lancaster applies for, directs, and oversees the administration of various Federal, State, and local grants, as well as other funding sources, on an annual basis. To help streamline application procedures and proactively assess the eligibility and viability of community programs and projects for available resources, the Departments of Administrative Services (Admin Services) and Community Planning and Economic Development (CPED) are collaborating to implement a Letter of Interest (LOI) process for all anticipated City-directed 2025 funding sources. This process will provide an opportunity for community partners to communicate their program and funding needs for the year, allowing the City to assess project suitability for the available funding sources and offer recommendations and support.

The City has identified strategic community priorities and needs within its <u>"Block by Block"</u> <u>Strategic Plan</u> and updated <u>Comprehensive Plan</u>. LOI respondents are encouraged to incorporate these priorities and needs into their responses.

**PROCESS:** Eligible community organizations are invited to express their interest in pursuing any available City-directed funding opportunities for program and project needs throughout 2025. Organizations must submit responses utilizing the **2025 Letter of Interest Response Form**. Each organization may submit one (1) response form per project for which they are interested in pursuing funding based on the anticipated 2025 City funding opportunities (see below).

The City will hold one (1) in-person information session on Tuesday, March 25, 2025, at 2:00 PM at City Hall, City Council Chambers located at 120 N. Duke Street, Lancaster, PA 17602 or virtually at <a href="https://us06web.zoom.us/j/85386895186">https://us06web.zoom.us/j/85386895186</a>. Subsequently, it will hold virtual office hours on April 8 and April 14, 2025, from 10:00 – 11:00 AM. <u>LOI responses are due by 5:00 PM on Friday, April 18, 2025</u>. Response Forms should be emailed to Jennifer Rummel at <u>jrummel@cityoflancasterpa.gov</u>.

**EVALUTION:** The City of Lancaster plans to evaluate organizational responses to assess project/program eligibility and suitability for the available funding sources. LOI responses will be evaluated on the following basis:

• Project/Program Alignment with Available Funding Sources

- Viability of Project Timeline with Application Process(es)
- Demonstration of Organizational Capacity
- Ability to Meet Grant Requirements
- Level of Risk

The City will then provide each organization that submitted a response with the results of its evaluation, including an assessment of the feasibility of the project(s)/program(s) for Citydirected funding opportunities, recommendations for the organization to build capacity to make projects eligible for City-directed funding, and may include opportunities for technical assistance for training and capacity building. The City will vet all LOI responses indicating an interest in pursuing LSA funding and make a determination of support based on this assessment.
